Directly supervised/Patient care.

Maximum enrollment of 8 for Inpatient 1 for Consultation

Prerequisites: Psychiatry 803

Goals: The student will have experience in one of or a combination of three settings: adult involuntary acute care inpatient unit, active Consultation Liaison service, or psychiatric urgent care center. The student may request the combination of settings desired and will be directly supervised by faculty with expertise in the field chosen.

Format: Students will participate fully and directly in patient care as part of a multidisciplinary treatment team. A core curriculum of readings is provided, and this can be readily supplemented based on a particular student's interest. In addition, students attend PGY-1 didactic classes on Wednesdays and have weekly classes taught by either a resident or the Medical Student Education Director. These classes are geared specifically for their level of training.

Evaluation Methods: Students will be evaluated by their attendings and residents via formal supervision.

Prerequisites: Psychiatry 803.

Goals: Enhanced knowledge and clinical expertise in the evaluation and treatment of adult psychiatric illness.

Format: Supervised clinical evaluation and treatment of adult psychiatric patients in inpatient, consultation and emergency settings and attendance at appropriate lectures, seminars and conferences.

Evaluation Methods: Students will be evaluated by their preceptors via formal supervision, student self-evaluation and course evaluation by the student.

Directly supervised/Patient care.

Maximum enrollment of 1

Prerequisites: Pediatrics 803

Goals: To understand basic child-adolescent behavioral syndromes through assessment process and to become familiar with treatment.

Format: The student will observe and participate in the outpatient pediatric psychiatry and psychology clinics, i.e., ADHD, Tourette's, Pain and Biofeedback clinics. Additionally, the student will be involved in pediatric psychological testing and inpatient team assessment. The student should be able to do a basic screening of behavior problems. There is a formal weekly lecture series.

Evaluation Methods: The attending's written evaluation will be based upon the student's interest, motivation and assimilation of material through handouts, observation and discussion. The student will also be evaluated on his/her ability to interact with families and patients.
